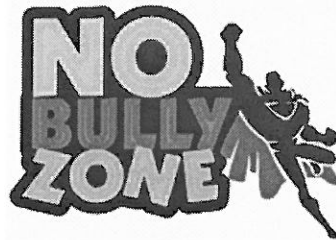
Character Council Speech on Being Respectful
